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REGISTRATION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

ELIGIBILITY: Continuing Education programs are open to residents of Hicksville and neighboring communities. **Registrants must be at least 18 years old.**

REGISTRATION:

- You may register **by mail** immediately upon receipt of flyer. You must access the registration form on the district website, www.hicksvillepublicschools.org. (Receipt of mail registrations will **NOT** be acknowledged.) Send a separate registration form and check for each class or trip Be sure to include your phone number on the registration form so we can contact you if there's a cancellation. Trip registration is continuous.
- **Walk-In** Registration begins on February 13th from 3:30-7:30pm in the Hicksville High School lobby.
- **In-person** registration will be at Hicksville High School in room 105, **Monday-Thursday 3:30-7:30 pm**. It will continue until the first day of class if openings remain.

MINIMUM REGISTRATION: Adult programs must operate on a self-supporting basis, so a minimum number of students are required in order to conduct a course. **If enrollment is inadequate, the class will be cancelled.**

PAYMENT: CHECKS ONLY! Checks should be made out to **Hicksville Public Schools**.

FEES: Course fees are listed with each course. Non-residents pay an additional \$15.00 per course.

Exceptions: Craft classes may require additional payment for supplies. See individual descriptions for more information.

REFUNDS: The full registration fee will be refunded only when a class or trip is full or cancelled.

CLOSINGS: If schools are closed or if school is dismissed early due to inclement weather, Continuing Education classes will not be held. See district calendar for holiday schedule.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES: Teachers are responsible for contacting students if they cancel a class. A make-up class will be provided.

SENIOR CITIZENS: Hicksville senior citizens (age 60 or older) are eligible for free tuition for many courses. Some courses require a reduced fee.
